

We are aware that many of you have got involved with locally formed groups to support each other in the present situation and this seems to be the best way of helping everyone. We would encourage those of you with near neighbours who are elderly and who you are not sure they have family support, to please get in touch with them. Drop a note through their door with your phone number...perhaps all those teenagers who have escaped GCSE's and A-levels could do this?

If you need help and cannot get it, please ring the Town Council on **01908 585368** and we will try to help. We are ready to action whatever the Government requires us to do. Alternatively, ring **Helping Hands** on **07934 287255** if you live in Woburn Sands or Aspley Heath. All their volunteers are DBS checked. Ring to register as someone needing assistance. Love Woburn Sands are also providing and managing volunteers for prescription collection and delivery, but you need to ring Asplands to access this service.

If you can help with Town Council or Helping Hands or Love WS work, please ring them. Most of the people involved with these organisations are themselves in the over 70 group!

ASPLANDS MEDICAL CENTRE

has shut its Woburn Surgery although calls there will be transferred to Asplands. If you usually collect prescriptions from Woburn, you should get a family member or friend to now collect from Asplands itself. All non urgent routine checks and services are also suspended so that the surgery can concentrate on urgent care. Of course, on no account should you go to the surgery if you have a fever or persistent new cough or indeed if anyone you have been in contact with has these symptoms. If you ring the surgery for an appointment you will be asked what is wrong and offered the appropriate means of a solution, probably a phone chat.

Several local pubs/restaurants and shops are offering services and further details can be seen on their relevant websites. OTHER CLOSURES AND CANCELLATIONS:

Milton Keynes Library service has closed all libraries. You can return books through the letter box at our library. All book clubs operated through the library service are also closed. Keep the book you currently have until the service resumes.

The Annual Town Meeting scheduled for 21 April is cancelled and reports which would have been delivered there will be on our website after that date.

VE Day Celebrations which were planned for 8 May will sadly not take place. We are very grateful to Diana Young from Churches Together, Len Jenkins and Karen Boote from Woburn Sands Band and Siobhan and her Jazz Majors who have all been involved with us in planning this event.

Community Market won't go ahead in April, but watch their face book page: Woburn Sands Community Market as some stall holders may have items for sale on that.

The Recreation Ground and Edgewick Farm are both still open unless the Government issues new orders, but adhere to the 2m distancing and in particular, no use of playground equipment, no kicking a football around with mates. Wash your hands before and after your outing and please, please put your dog's poo in the bins or take it home and put it in your black sack.

AND NOW NORMAL COUNCIL NEWS

Expressway: The Government has announced it will not be going ahead with the Oxford to Cambridge Expressway, but will instead look at improving existing road links between the two cities. This does, however, mean that developers will shortly be submitting their proposals under Plan SEMK for 3000 houses between Bow Brickhill, Woburn Sands and Wavendon either side of the railway. We are closely involved with the master plan for this project with the prime aim of protecting Woburn Sands from the impact of this development.

CCTV: In the near future our new CCTV system will be installed initially in the High Street. It will enable us to monitor car parking and those parking on double yellow lines and going over the waiting limit as well as looking at unacceptable behaviour Including, during Covid 19 restrictions, keeping 2m apart from each other! This is largely being funded from monies saved from the removal of the public toilet. The camera can be moved elsewhere in the town as necessary.





20mph speed limits: Milton Keynes Council has gone ahead with its proposal to implement this speed limit in Chapel Street, Theydon Avenue, Wood Street and the High Street. We have opposed some of the waiting restrictions proposed by Milton Keynes Council and await the outcome of these proposals.

Two new councillors: We are delighted to welcome Jo Green and Richard Lanyon-Hogg on to our council. Both have considerable experience which we are sure will enhance our team. We thank others who also applied to fill the two vacancies we had. It is reassuring to know local interest exists in our work.



Community Grants: We give small grants to locally based groups/organisations each year, and the slot for applying for these is **1 April-12 June**. Please contact the office if you need further information or download a form from our website.



Climate Control Group: the current Covid 19 crisis must not let us lose sight of the overriding problems building in our world through climate change. Our own local group led by Cllr Peter Skelton is looking at ways to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and mitigate the effects of climate change in our community. Shoppers car park: There are a few cars seemingly permanently parked in our car park. At least one is in a space which will shortly be devoted to an electric car recharging point, so will be removed if the owner does not do so very soon! This car park is for the benefit of shoppers and users of the High Street facilities and is important in maintaining the viability of our High Street. It is not reasonable to leave a car here permanently.

News from Edgewick Farm. Following an autumn blessed with bumper crops of apples and parasol mushrooms, we've had a relatively mild if wet winter, and the first frogs' spawn was seen in the pond on 8 March. The Friends of Edgewick Farm are trying to encourage more wild flowers in the fields. The top field is being sown with yellow rattle and the corn cockle seeded in the picnic area last autumn is already showing its pretty mauve flowers. The doughty volunteers have been busy all year with cutting back over exuberant gorse and brambles, fencing repairs, some tree surgery and their least favourite jobs of litter picking and collecting dog poo bags from the few inconsiderate dog owners who seemingly have still not discovered the dog poo bins nearby. The board walk laying project continues, weather and Corona virus permitting, and we may need extra volunteer sessions later including help loading trailers and portaging materials....contact Peter Skelton (as for Climate Change group).







A Fuller's earth heritage trail is being worked on and will be launched in MK Heritage week in September....we hope! It will be over the Greensand Escarpment starting from Edgewick Farm and tracing the local history of Fuller's earth workings locally.
