Planning Matters

Our Neighbourhood Plan continues its progress and attracted a visit from Nick Boles, Parliamentary Under Secretary of State, on 9th January, as ours is one of the first in the country to reach this stage. He was very impressed with the Plan and congratulated us on the process and content as well as the fact that we had not used consultants to undertake the work. Many local organisations sent along representatives



to join us for coffee with Nick Boles and Iain Stewart, our MP.

A bigger test will be had on 29th January when the Inspector appointed to judge its validity will hold a hearing at The Memorial Hall starting at 9.30am. He is particularly concerned to ensure that the Plan conforms to the provisions of Milton Keynes Core Strategy and has invited those developers who indicated that they felt it did not do so to speak. Contributors from Milton Keynes Council and from the Town Council will be able to respond. The hearing is scheduled to finish by lunch time and members of the public are welcome to attend. If all goes well, the final stage is a town referendum to adopt it when you will all be able to vote. A simple majority "Yes" vote will make it binding on any future developments within the parish.

Connelly Homes will shortly be commencing their conversion of Greens Hotel to flats whilst also getting the new Bowls Club built at the common in Aspley Guise, and the new bowling green prepared. We will endeavour to ensure that Milton Keynes Council can impose restrictions to mean minimum upset to neighbouring streets during what is likely to be a very difficult construction period in terms of noise and heavy vehicles.

Taylor Wimpey have sought amendments to their Phase 3 application at Parklands, most of which is now built. It will mean more 1 bedroom flats replacing 2 bedded ones, but no change in the overall numbers or affordable % which was decreased to 20% at the end of last year. Phase 4 construction will be proceeding this year.

The first phase of the developments in the SLA has just been submitted close on the heels of the adoption of the Development Framework. These are 2 outline applications, one 13/02382/OUT is for Glebe Farm land, south of A421, off Newport Road, Wavendon, which is for mixed use including up to 1187 dwellings, and the other, 13/02381/OUT, is further east and south of the A421 at Eagle Farm South for up to 387 dwellings and mixed uses. We are putting some details on our website but if you wish to view them in more detail, they will be on MKC website. Sadly, but not unexpectedly, some of the restrictions included in the Framework document have been ignored by the developers, most significantly for us being the construction of a signal controlled access point onto the A5130, Newport Road, exactly what we fought to avoid or at least delay. The key points of our objections will be on our website, and your support by more letters of objection will be very helpful. The developers are displaying their plans in a public consultation 4pm-9pm on Wed 29 Jan at Wavendon Community Centre.

News from the Library and....

Milton Keynes Library service is keen to train some volunteers who would then be able to extend our library opening hours by providing staff cover. This will be an opportunity for some more people to get involved in the Library and to ensure its continuing success. If you could consider taking part in this scheme, please contact the Town Clerk. It is hoped that any given volunteer would not be called upon more than once or twice per month and just for a couple of hours. We also need to hear from any of you about library opening hours. When would be a good time for the library to be open beyond its existing hours. Would new users who find it difficult to get to the library in its current opening hours, use it if it was open more at weekends? Please contact the Clerk with your thoughts on this.

The recently started **Knit and Natter** group held every Tuesday in the library 3.45- 4.30pm has proved popular with children and adults alike. Do join them sometime, whether you are a beginner or expert knitter.



Another popular weekly event in the library is the **Wednesday morning Senior Friends.** The numbers have increased since its launch 6 months ago and most people, once they try it, want to come back. It's a relaxed and informal environment with some staying the full 2 hours of opening (10am –noon) whilst others just drop in for a coffee and cake. A couple of recent comments from senior citizens about this group were: "I love it. It turns a lonely day into a happy one" and "I've met so many lovely people whom I didn't know and I love coming here". Praise indeed, and huge thanks to the organisers, Adrienne Rutter and Julie Nicholls and The Coop for the provision of tea and coffee.

The Woburn Sands Book Club has been running for nearly three years and it now has a vacancy for one lucky person! It meets on the second Tuesday of every month in the library for just an hour starting at 6pm. There are 10 in the group with books chosen by the group from an extensive list provided by MKC Library service. Contact the editor or the librarian if you would like to join the group.

The Age UK advisory service continues to offer advice to anyone seeking it in the mornings during library weekday opening hours. This is funded by the Town council.

The Library hosted an evening of seasonal poetry in December, enjoyed by the few who attended. We hope to have more evenings of perhaps music and poetry readings during the year. **The library is an ideal venue for small informal gatherings** outside library opening hours. Please contact the Clerk if you would like to book this facility.
