

CHANGES TO WASTE AND RECYCLING COLLECTIONS OVER CHRISTMAS AND NEW YEAR

Due to the bank holidays, collections between Wednesday 25 December and Friday 10 January will take place up to two working days later than usual, as below:




A NEW STATION FOR WOBURN SANDS?

During the 2021 consultation, we explained that moving Woburn Sands station would allow us to build a bigger and better station, and this has subsequently been confirmed as outlined in the Consultation Document published on 14 November. The station would need to be expanded to accommodate the increased number of passengers that would use East West Rail and the longer trains that would carry them. This would not be possible to the same extent in its existing location.

For this reason, a relocated station a short distance to the west of the existing station is considered to offer a better passenger experience and more options for how passengers get to the station, including drop-off and parking facilities and bus stops. The station and car park would be located to the west of the existing station and to the north of the railway within the area of the South East Milton Keynes Strategic Urban Extension proposal (SEMK). This location would continue to provide easy access for existing residential areas via Newport Road and direct access to the new housing development.

A new road bridge is planned to the west of the proposed station as part of the SEMK development in this area and is therefore not included in our proposals. We will continue to have further discussions with the developer and Milton Keynes City Council as the proposals are progressed. Under the current proposals, there would be up to four trains per hour.



EWR said a number of stations may need to be consolidated or built to offer more services.



ADVICE FROM MILTON KEYNES CITY COUNCIL REGARDING FLOODING

If you, your family or your business are involved in an incident and believe you may be in danger always telephone 999 to request the appropriate emergency assistance. If you are not in danger but may be affected indirectly, you may be advised to GO IN, STAY IN, TUNE IN.

Although we will do all we can to assist, <u>please</u> note that it is the responsibility of owners and occupiers to protect their property in the event of flooding. We do not hold unlimited supplies of key items such as water pumps or sandbags.

REPORTING FLOODING

If your property is in imminent danger of flooding, please call our Customer Services 01908 252353. Our phone lines are open from 09:00 - 5:15 Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday, and 10:00 - 5:15 on Wednesdays. Out of hours emergency telephone: 01908 226699.

5 STEPS TO FOLLOW DURING A FLOOD EVENT

STEP 1

Before flood water enters your home, close and lock downstairs windows and doors. Keep the keys safely to hand and move upstairs.

STEP 2

Continue to listen to situation updates from your local radio station and Floodline on: **0345 988 1188.**

STEP 3

Stay in your property if safe to do so or until either the emergency services tell you otherwise or the floodwater has gone.

STEP 4

Do not walk through floodwater. If it is necessary to walk through shallow water, take care for hidden holes, obstacles and other hazards.

STEP 5

If you come into contact with floodwater, wash any exposed body parts with bottled or cool boiled water before handling food or looking after wounds.



NEWS FROM WOBURN SANDS LIBRARY



2024 saw our largest ever offering of summer workshops and they were very well received with over 90 local youngsters participating. Two new workshops this year - 'Let's Make Music', with members of the Woburn Sands Band, and 'Craft a Model Beach Hut' from decorated recycled wood - expanded the range of creativity and complemented existing popular workshops ran by Julie and Chris, and local textile artist Myra. Whether in the form of a visual or an audio expression, youngsters achieved so much in the hour and impressed adults gave lovely feedback. This all came free of charge thanks to the ongoing support of the Woburn Sands Town Council. We are fully aware of our exceptional position here at the Woburn Sands branch library – a position of excellent relationship with the local Town Council and our supportive partnership was celebrated in 2024 with the 10 year anniversary of the use of volunteers to extend the opening hours above the staffed hours. We are forever indebted to these volunteers for the precious time which they continue to donate This has meant that for over 10 years we have maximised access and availability, meaning footfall and issues of books are robust, especially noteworthy given the size of our community

setting. Supplementing our Town Council volunteers and our Storytime volunteers we have some remarkable youngsters associated with us throughout the year: our fabulous Duke of Edinburgh's Award students of 2024, and the hard-working Summer Reading Challenge volunteers as well as ongoing young volunteers who help with the routine work of the library. Thanks are due again to all these people and, of course, to all our customers for continuing to use this branch for their collectively large reading appetite in 2024!

We have space in our Reading Group which meets the 3rd Tuesday of every month 7pm-8pm. If you fancy some more formalised book chat on a monthly book choice then phone library on 01908 582033 to enquire, or pop into the library.

Support from our community is undoubtedly what makes the branch successful: this year our Knit and Natter group (Fridays 2pm to 3.30pm) increased from a regular 2 to 6 members and Storytime hit an all time high attendance this year with no less than 25 children in one of the August weeks. Storytime is delivered by our dedicated and skilled volunteers Julie, Trudy and Denise, you can witness their magic with your little ones any and every Tuesday morning 11.15 to 11.45, free of charge.

We have been fortunate to benefit from generous donations of books this year, so for now we are asking for donations only of books in pristine condition and published in 2024/2025 - if you can help it is very much appreciated.

If you can spare a few hours a month to help with running the library, ask when you next visit.

Our volunteers are kept busy and further help is always welcome!

MK ENVIRONMENTAL CRIME UNIT

The Town Clerk has been contacted by MK Environmental Crime Unit with this message: for the last few years, MKCC has contracted WISE to deploy uniformed litter wardens to take action against those who drop litter and fail to pick up after their dog has fouled on land, in the open air, that the public has access to. They have the power to issue Fixed

Penalty Notices to offenders and provide a visible presence to make people think twice about offending. They have asked the Town Council to let them know if there are any particular problem areas.

Wardens will be patrolling looking for offenders, if you do not want to be served with a Fixed Penalty Notice then pick up after your dog and don't drop litter!

FLOODING

Following the flooding there has been a meeting between parish councils, MK Council Officers and residents on how to prevent flooding and protect people and property. This has been instigated by Lorraine Hearn who has worked hard liaising with the community, raised money to buy equipment, as well as checking and reporting blocked drains and gulleys, and encouraging others to do the same.
